#### Early Years Funding – 8 Elements



- Universal & targeted entitlement for 3 & 4-Year-Old.
- 2-year-old offer for families receiving additional support (previously known as disadvantaged 2-year-old offer.
- Working Parent 2-year-old offer
- Working Parent 9 months to 2-YO
- Early Years (EY) Pupil Premium additional funding for disadvantaged children was extended to all the Early Years offers from 2024/25.
  - In 2025/26 (from April 2025) this will be paid as a top up of £1.00 per hour up to a maximum of £570 per year (38 weeks).
  - This is a 50.5% increase on the 2024/25 funded rate.
- Disability Access Fund additional per pupil funding for those receiving Disability Living Allowance to access all EY entitlements.
  - Funding paid to providers will be £938 per eligible pupil per annum (2024/25 rate was £910).
- Maintained Nursery School Supplementary Funding
  - additional funding for maintained nurseries only provided by the National Funding Formula.

#### **Funding Principles**



#### **How Does Funding Work and How is it Paid?**

- Funding for entitlements is based on part time equivalent hours (PTE) which is 15 hours across 38 weeks of the year (570 hours per year)
- A 30 hours entitlement would equate to 1,140 funded hours per year.
- Providers may wish to consider their charging structure in light of expanded entitlements and government funding in 2025/26.
- Funding is paid termly with 12.66 weeks per term.
- Funding is provided by financial year April to March (not calendar or academic year)
- There is a termly Department for Education headcount to facilitate funding of the entitlements. Accurate and timely data submissions are critical to accurate payments.
- Payments are made on estimates termly in advance with adjustments made following termly headcount and validated codes.

#### 3 and 4 -year-old funding: Key Changes



- Government Funding under the National Funding Formula increased by 16p per hour from April 2025 and allocated through:
  - An increase base rate by 4p per hour to £6.72 per hour from April 2025 (a year-on-year increase of 0.6%)
  - 12p per funded hour for mainstreamed teachers pay grants to primary schools to be paid through the quality supplement.
- Budgeted average deprivation supplement rate remains at £0.72 per hour) to remain within regulation of 12% maximum supplements.
- SEN Inclusion Fund (SENIF) maintained at 4% of government funding in 2025/26.
- Reduction in contingency and central expenditure budget allows sector support for Early Years Inclusion Support Services to be maintained and delivered from Maintained Nursery Schools from April 2025.
  - Central expenditure is limited to 4% from April 2025, a reduction of 1% year on year. Passthrough requirement has increased from 95% to 96%

#### 2-year-old funding: Key Changes



- Two government funded offers:
  - 1. Offer to families receiving additional support (formerly called the Disadvantaged 2-year-old offer) remains at 15 hours.
  - 2. Working parent entitlement increases to 30 hours from September 2025.
- Both offers require a local formula which may include supplements. The H&F model proposes to continue to use deprivation supplements.
  - single base funding rate of £10.05 per hour from April 2025 (an increase of 69 pence per hour versus 24/25 and a year-on-year increase of 7.37%)
  - deprivation supplement for both offers use proposed IDACI bands for 3 and 4 YO offer averages £0.87 per hour across both offers (average of £0.97 for Additional Support Cohort)
- SEN Inclusion Fund budget (SENIF) increase to allow for expanded entitlements at 4% of government funding.
- Central spend reduced to 4% of government funding in line with National Funding Formula for Early Years.
- Contingency budget reduced as new entitlements embed.

## Under 2s offer for Working Parents – key changes



- requires a local formula which may include supplements
- 15 hours from September 2024 for children 9 months to 2 years. Increases to 30 hours from September 2025.
  - base funding rate of £14.39 per hour from April 2025 (an increase of 94 pence per hour versus 24/25 and a year-on-year increase of 6.99%)
  - deprivation supplement
     — use proposed IDACI bands for 3 and 4
     YO offer averages £0.77 per hour
- SEN Inclusion Fund (SENIF) budget increase to allow for expanded entitlements at 4% of government funding.
- Central spend reduced to 4% of government funding in line with National Funding Formula for Early Years.
