According to SEND statistics from the Department for Education, which are based on the school census, **there are over 160,000 autistic pupils in schools across England.** Over 70% are in mainstream school...
1 in 60 children in schools in England (DfE, 2019) are registered as autistic so **all** school staff are likely to come into contact with autistic children.



The AET Professional Development Programme (PDP) is the only Department for Education Supported, CPD-accredited Autism Training Programme that has been co-produced with parents, professionals and a panel of autistic young experts.
