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What is the Early Years Teacher Degree Apprenticeship (EYTDA)

The Early Years Teacher Degree Apprenticeship (EYTDA) is a new undergraduate route to Early Years Teacher Status that gives trainees the opportunity to earn while they learn.

A sector-led trailblazer group worked with the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education to develop the EYTDA, a full and relevant level 6 early years qualification with Early Years Teacher Status.

The EYTDA is aimed at school leavers and existing early years staff qualified to Level 3 qualification and holding GCSE English, Maths and Science, who aspire to become an Early Years Teacher.

The EYTDA is a three-year apprenticeship which is designed to fit alongside the vital work trainees carry out day-to-day in early years settings. Employers who pay the apprenticeship levy will be eligible to use their levy payments for the Early Years Teacher Degree Apprenticeship. Employers who are not eligible to make apprenticeship levy payments can co-fund the cost of the apprenticeship training, with Government contributing 95% of course costs.

What benefits will the EYTDA bring to early years settings?

The EYTDA will be delivered through Accredited Initial Teacher Training Providers who are registered on the Apprenticeship Provider and Assessment Register (APAR). Courses will deliver high-quality ITT training leading to Early Years Teacher Status as training providers will have to teach to:

- ✓ the Early Years Teacher apprenticeship standard
- ✓ the Teacher Standards (Early Years)
- ✓ the QAA early childhood studies benchmark statements

Trainees can be new to early years or already in an early years role, enabling employers to expand and/or upskill their team according to their need. Trainees will earn as they learn, which means:

- ✓ employers can be involved in planning and delivering their trainee's training
- ✓ trainees will gain valuable practical experience whilst training
- ✓ trainees will bring their learning into their work
- ✓ at their employer's discretion, trainees can be counted in level 3 staff:child ratios during their training

Apprenticeship Availability

Training providers are expected to begin delivering EYTDA apprenticeships from September 2026, although some may be ready sooner. Employers are encouraged to look out for training providers beginning to promote their courses from late summer 2025 and check <u>Find</u> apprenticeship training if you're an employer - GOV.UK.
