Item 1. Welcome and Review Actions from last meeting

Diana Edgecombe welcomed all to the meeting and attendees introduced themselves.

Item 2. Wetlands Centre - Mark Stead and Paul Lawston

Paul explained Wetlands is a Nature reserve which is located in Barnes and originally opened in 2000. The whole philosophy of the reserve was to bring wildlife to where people are so that more people could get to enjoy nature.

As a nature reserve, Wetlands offers diverse wildlife, wildfowl, 2 otters and an opportunity for people to pond dip, bird watching and they also have a wild walk which is all outdoor nature based.

For schools Wetlands have a diverse range of things:

- Pond explorers
- Minibeast Safari
- Investigating mammals
- Brilliant bird adaptations
- Nests eggs and baby birds
- Birds, beaks and feeding techniques
- Bird researchers
- Bird ID challenge
- Plant detectives
- The water cycle, wetlands and me
- Plastic planet
- Climate champions

Many supporting teaching resources are free to download from website and visitors are able to hire out other resources at the centre, i.e. binoculars etc.

Mark explained that as well as paid for services, Wetlands have just launched a nature catchment service for disadvantaged schools. This means that rather than a one-off visit, pupils are given associated work to engage in before visit. The programme is entitled Ava's Destiny and work is also followed up after the visit, both at home with parents/carers home and at school. Slide show showed testimonies from pupils and teachers.
