

# Holocaust Memorial Day


**Holocaust Memorial Day** (HMD) is on 27th January 2022, and there are lots of free resources online to help teachers plan lessons for pupils of all ages. Those for younger children are carefully designed to be age appropriate. The [HMD education guidelines](#) for teachers cover age appropriate ways to introduce and discuss the Holocaust and genocide in schools. These guidelines recommend that only children aged eight years or more should take part in your HMD activity.

The resources include:

- An HMD assembly for [primary schools](#)
- Creative activities such as the [Make a Memorial Flame Display](#) resource, using readily available and low cost materials
- More hands on resources include the [Traditional Rwandan dance tutorial](#), [recipe cards](#), and song sheets in the [creative activities](#) section
- [Easy to read life stories](#), which provide an accessible way for older primary pupils to understand the experiences of people affected by genocide.
