Key activities outside – planned and spontaneous:

- Story and drama
- Dance spontaneous and planned
- Music, beat and rhythm
- Song and rhyme

Suggested learning and development links:

- Start to take part in some group activities which they make up for themselves, or in teams.
- Increasingly be able to use and remember sequences and patterns of movement – related to music and rhyme.
- Remember and sing familiar songs.
- Pitch match.
- Sing the melodic shape of familiar songs.
- Create their own songs or improvise a song around one they know.
- Play instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas
- Listen with increased attention to sounds.
- Progress towards a more fluent style of moving with developing control and grace.
- Listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing their feelings and responses.
- Sing in a group or on their own, increasingly matching the pitch or following the melody.

- Watch and talk about dance and performance art.
- Explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups.
