# **Key activities:**

- Open-ended resources that can 'stand in the place of' other things, e.g., a wooden brick can be a mobile phone, a long wooden slate a 'plane propeller
- Open-ended conversations between children and adult to child(ren)
- Planned outside role play areas and dens
- Spontaneous role play areas based on children's immediate interests

### Suggested learning and development links:

- Start a conversation with an adult or friend and continue it for many turns.
- Use talk to organize themselves and their play.
- Take part in simple pretend play.
- Begin to develop complex stories.
- Take part in simple pretend play, using an object to represent something else even though they are not similar.
- Learn and use new vocabulary.
- Describe events in some detail.
- Use talk to help work out problems and organize thinking and activities.
- Develop storylines in their pretend play.
