## An exciting new performance opportunity for young London-based musicians at the Royal Albert Hall in 2022





- To offer a concert platform for young creatives to showcase their original works
- To embed artist development as part of the project, creating meaningful opportunities for the young creatives to continue their growth as an artist
- To attract an audience of primary and secondary school groups, inspiring students to continue pursuing music studies
- To create a show which is unlike schools concerts which are currently on offer at other venues



- **Future Makers** will be a showcase of young talent from across the London boroughs on the Royal Albert Hall main stage.
- We will source performers through London Music Hubs, each of whom can submit up to 3 acts to be considered for the show.
- After a live audition round, up to 10 acts will be selected to perform.
- Each act taking part in the event will receive feedback from a stellar industry panel, and a winning act will receive a bespoke package of support and follow-up opportunities.
- The audience will be KS2 and KS3 students, as well as invited industry guests.

- . Music performed must be original music written by or for the performers
  - Composers can enter but must be alongside a performance ensemble of young people able to perform their composition(s)
    - All performers/composers involved must be Years 10-13 in the academic year 2021/2022
  - Submissions must be between 4 and 6 mins long and the same piece (or pieces) must be performed in the concert if selected for the main show



- . We actively encourage SEND acts to apply and will provide support at all stages of the process
- . Submissions can be of any genre or a mixture of genres
- . Music can be based around spoken word or performance poetry but must include a musical element
- . Electronic music submissions are welcomed, but hese must include at least one live performance element
- . At least 50% of any act's members must be from state maintained schools



A winning act will be selected, to receive a bespoke package of opportunities which will support their future development as an artist. This might include studio time, mentoring and further performance opportunities.







- The concert will be presented by celebrity hosts and feature a special guest performance.
- The target audience will be KS2 and KS3 students, who we hope to inspire to continue with their musical studies by seeing their peers performing in a high profile event at the Hall.
- As well as the industry panel, other industry guests will be invited and the Heads of all London Music Hubs.
