Shelf Life was devised by Michael Holland whilst Head of Education at Chelsea Physic Garden, London. In 2004, it featured at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show and has subsequently popped up in various other places - from Hammersmith, Mexico, Melbourne and many places in between.

Basically, plants are grown in the product packaging that corresponds to the ingredients, such as an orange plant growing in a carton of orange juice, or a bean plant from a tin of baked beans.

After 25 years at Chelsea Physic Garden, Michael is now a freelance educator and his first book 'I Ate Sunshine for Breakfast' (a compendium of plants for children) came out in April 2020. He is an avid wildlife gardener and is passionate about engaging people with nature.
