

How to describe Safe Families

Safe Families provides early intervention and 'wraparound care' for struggling families, helping them to get back on their feet. Safe Families works to avert escalation of need by offering individually tailored support, including overnight care of the child, where this is beneficial, helping to prevent the onset of crises that may necessitate statutory intervention. The Safe Families model offers families in crisis a team of approved and trained volunteers to support them; each offer is unique, dependent on the needs of the family and is determined through a strength-based approach.

Key criteria for referral

- The family in question is in need of befriending and [redacted]
- The support requested fits within the thresholds of risk appropriate to volunteer support.
- The children are from across the continuum of need
- The support is genuinely wanted by the family with clear parental consent.

How volunteers help



Family Friends

Volunteers who offer family support. Giving simple advice and support to parents and children when they need it most, enabling parents to feel less isolated.



Resource Friends



Volunteers who are able to provide useful items such as a cot or children's clothing, or have helpful skills such as cooking or gardening.

All volunteers go through a robust recruitment process and training to act as Family Friends and Host Homes. Our Family Support Managers carry out regular reviews throughout until the family is back on its feet.

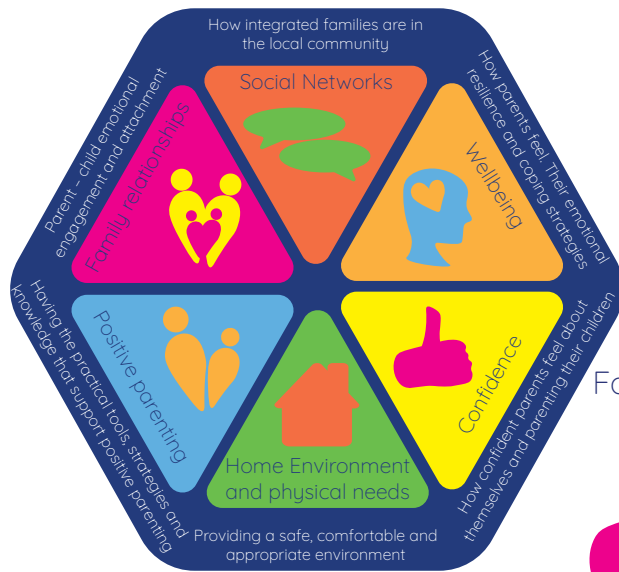

Safe Families for Children is proving really effective in helping Nottingham City Council stem the flow of children into care. Our analysis suggests that over a quarter of the children benefitting from the support of Safe Families would have ended up in our care (albeit, the majority for a short period of time) equating around a 10% reduction of ‘flow’ into care. Our social work teams love it and it’s now fully embedded within our overall processes and menu of support.
