This is especially relevant for the Part Two coaching session which relies on EYPs being able to use this unique opportunity to discuss and problem-solve easily with colleagues in other settings.

Building Attention in the Early Years

Overview: Following this online workshop you will have refreshed your knowledge of what kind of social communication difficulties a child may present with, learn how to identify a child with social communication difficulties, and place a child in an appropriate group based on their current stage of communication.

You will also learn how to use a simple flowchart tool to find which type of group would be most appropriate for a child's current needs and be able to identify appropriate goals for children. You will develop an understanding of how to plan and run small group, adult-led activities to help children with social communication difficulties build shared attention skills and learn strategies you can use to support children to achieve their goals within a social communication group. You will also develop an understanding of how to effectively use visual support in small group activities.

Supporting Children with Developmental Language Disorder (DLD) in Early Years Settings (a language difficulty that affects 3 children in every classroom)

Making Sense of Echolalia (Gestalt Language Processing): identifying and supporting the language development of children who learn language in 'chunks'.

Overview: Did you know there are two ways to learn language? When small children listen to adults talking, they usually 'home in' on the key words and as they learn these key words, they use them like building blocks – at first one word at a time, then 2 together, then 3 and so on... we call these 'Analytical language learners'

But I'm sure you know some children, who use 'jargon' (word-like strings of sounds that can't yet be understood), with rich intonation or 'learned phrases' you can recognise from songs, TV shows etc?

We call these: 'Intonational language learners', because they 'home in' on the intonation/musicality of the spoken language they hear and learn language in 'chunks'

This session will give you new insights into how you can help these children to develop more flexible spoken language skills.

Helicopter Stories

Overview: Helicopter Stories is a powerful, evidence-based technique for developing children's confidence, curiosity, creativity, and communication skills.

This workshop will introduce this technique in which children dictate their stories to an adult and later the same session or day the children act out their stories from their place round the circle, with no props. In the session you will learn how to run effective Helicopter Stories sessions which have been proven by the Open University to develop confidence and communication skills in children aged 2-5.
